One of the many ventures used by the foundation to raise money for research and conservation is to partner with state lottery programs. They have been involved with the Florida lottery program and in 2013 began working with the South Carolina Educational Lottery. A portion of the price from every ticket sold goes to the Ocean Foundation to fund research and conservation in that state.

It was from these proceeds that Dr. Harvey and the Board of the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, were able to provide a grant to the DRP for the purchase of five pop-off archival satellite tags and the needed satellite time. These high-tech instruments will be placed on dolphinfish off the South Carolina coast to begin tracking the individual routes they take during their migration. It is hoped that some of the fish will be tracked for as long as nine months.

In his presentation, Dr. Harvey noted that dolphinfish are one of the most important species to the offshore recreational fisheries of the U.S. Atlantic and Gulf coasts and that the Dolphinfish Research Program is the leading study on this important game fish. He also noted that it is important for research programs to involve the public as much as possible so as to make them part of ocean conservation.

Just such a place exists in the Indian Ocean. It is the Gulf of Oman, according to Hussein Azab of Oman. In this area off Oman, oil tankers ride their anchor waiting their turn to load oil bound for ports all over the world. While sitting at anchor these ships serve as giant fish aggregating devices. The local fishermen have quickly learned of the great fishing opportunity these mobile reefs can provide. Anglers move from one ship to the next, looking for schools of dolphin, lurking around the ships.

This different style of fishing for dolphin capitalizes on the dolphin's instinct to congregate under floating objects. In most areas fishermen have to rely on chance to find floating structure or create their own floating fish attractors, but off Oman mega-size floating reefs are abundant. This is just another example of how dolphin fishing techniques vary from region to region, adapting to the conditions that exist.

If you have fished for dolphin in other regions of the world outside the U.S. that employ different techniques from those commonly used in the states, I would like to hear about your experiences. Please email me with your stories.

Send in Your Tag Cards

2013 is quickly coming to a close. It is time for all tagging partners to check their boats or where they keep their tagging equipment for any tag cards that may have been used but overlooked and not sent in. Tag cards must be received by January 8, 2014, to count toward the 2013 year-end awards.

Participation has been good in 2013, with more than 160 anglers fishing on 93 different boats providing fish for tagging. A total of 1,294 dolphins have been tagged in the Atlantic, Caribbean and Gulf of Mexico with an addition 10 fish in the eastern Pacific off Mexico.
